## LIPIX Meaningful Use Services

Implementation of an electronic health record (EHR) system is only the first step towards achieving "Meaningful Use" on certified EHR technology. The next steps require time, resources, and expertise. # Meaningful Use Services



## The Basics of Stage 1

### Meaningful Use:

- ◆ Reporting period is 90 days for the first year and the full year for remaining years
- ◆ Reporting through attestation
- ◆ Providers must complete:
  - ✓ 15 core objectives
  - ✓ 5 of 10 menu objectives
  - ✓ 6 clinical quality measures
- ◆ To meet certain objectives/measures, 80% of patients must have records in certified EHR technology

## Practice Eligibility

LIPIX Meaningful Use Services offers subsidized assistance to practices with Priority Primary Care Providers (PPCPs).

A PPCP is defined as a licensed Doctor of Medicine (MD), Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine (DO), Nurse Practitioner (NP), Physician Assistant (PA), or Nurse Midwife with prescriptive privileges who provides primary care clinical services.

Providers must be practicing in one of the following settings:

- Individual or small group practices (defined as ten or fewer professionals with prescriptive privileges in the practice) primarily focused on primary care
- Public and Critical Access Hospitals
- Community Health Centers and Rural Health Clinics
- Other settings that predominantly serve uninsured, underinsured, and medically underserved populations
